West of Port Angeles is Lake Crescent a sparkling jewel of the Olympic Peninsula. Highway 101 hugs the south shore of the lake and arrives at Lake Crescent Lodge in Olympic National Park. The forests surrounding the lodge are a retreat for those seeking peace beneath wise old trees, The lake is a playground for those seeking a dip, a remote beach and a trophy catch. The lodge is a warm fireplace, a meal to remember and a restful sleep in the quiet of the park.



Olympic National Park is administered by the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior. The National Park Service was established by Congress in 1916 “to promote and regulate the use of the . . . national parks, monuments and reservations” in accordance with their purpose, which “is to conserve the scenery and the natural and historic objects and the wildlife therein . . . by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations.”

Olympic National Forest is administered by the Forest Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture. The Supervisor, along with District Rangers, is responsible for managing the Forest’s renewable resources - water, forage, timber, recreation and wildlife, as directed by Congress, under the principles of Multiple Use and Sustained Yield.
